Entry Fees: All fees are in US dollars. Make checks payable to "Equestrians Institute." Or, if you wish to pay by credit card, pay via PayPal at Paypal.me/eidriving and add \$15 service fee to total. If you need assistance paying by credit card, contact the organizer. Your entry is not accepted until fees are paid. El members receive a discount.

- **Basic Day Use Fee:** Basic Day Use Fees are mandatory if you will be driving your horse on Friday and/or Saturday to either school or participate in the scheduled events.
 - one day (Friday or Saturday) -- \$55 (\$50 for El members)
 - two days (Friday and Saturday) -- \$100 (\$90 for El members)
- Clinician Lesson: Lessons with Stacey or Sterling are \$120 per hour-long lesson (\$100 for El members)
- **Driving Derby:** \$25 per go (\$20 per go for El members)
- **Dressage Festival:** \$50 for two tests (\$45 for EI members) or \$30 for one test (\$28 for EI members). Please state on your entry form which dressage test(s) you want to have judged.
- Navigator Clinic: Group clinic \$35 per driver and navigator team (\$30 for El members). Semi-private navigator instruction (driver/navigator team with their turnout in an obstacle) from clinician \$40 fee (\$35 for El members). Must sign up for group clinic if signing up for semi-private navigator instruction.
- One Day Driving Trial: \$100 entry fee (\$90 entry fee for El members)
- One Day Combined Test: \$75 entry fee (\$65 for EI members)

Stall Fees and Arrangements:

- \$135 stall fee for Thursday through Sunday includes one bag of shavings and cleaning of stall after event. \$90 per stall for 2 days. \$65 per stall for 1 day.
- Stalls are available starting at 1pm on Thursday through 6pm on Sunday. Additional nights available for \$45 per stall per horse. Please coordinate in advance.
- One bag of shavings will be provided per stall for the event. If you need more, either order more in advance on your entry form or bring your own.
- Self-stalling or daily haul-in (no stall provided) allowed \$15 fee per day. No bedding provided and please clean up after your horse before departing event. Secure panels must be used for self-stalling. Horses cannot be left tied to the trailer unattended.
- No stall deposit required.

Refund Policy:

\$50 office fee will be deducted from all refunds. Before closing date, full refund minus office fee. After closing date up until 72 hours before event starts, full refund minus office fee only if can backfill from waiting list. No refunds after 72 hours prior to event start.

All DT participants will follow the same course. Maximum of 6 km, 4 to 5 obstacles depending on weather conditions and footing. All divisions/levels, be prepared to cross water.

OTHER INFORMATION:

Pony/VSE Measurement Cards:

ADS official measurement cards for Ponies and VSEs, required after 1/1/21, will be honored but not required at this event. If you do not have your pony officially measured, please measure him carefully at the withers in order to enter the proper classes. Awards:

- Dressage Festival ribbons top five placings for each level classes (by size of equine and number of equines
 in turnout) will be grouped together for Dressage awards. If multiple tests driven, the best score per level will
 be used in the award calculations.
- Driving Trial ribbons top five placings for each class.
- Combined Test ribbons top five placings for each class.
- Driving Derby top five placings in each division.

Safety:

- Medical armbands, or their equivalent such as Road ID, are strongly encouraged, but not required, for all persons riding on a cart or carriage. Medical armbands will be available for purchase.
- Per ADS rules, protective vests are required while on the marathon course, participating in the derby, and while schooling obstacles.
- Helmets are required during marathon-type activities and cones, and are encouraged at all times while on the carriage.
- Helmets and protective vests are always required for juniors (under 18).

Veterinary / Equine Health Requirements:

To promote health and welfare of all horses, Equestrians Institute complies with ADS and State rules regarding horse welfare, including but not limited to:

- Proof of vaccination or veterinary exemption for Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus current
 within six months of the event. See ADS Art. 6.3. Proof of vaccine must be provided at least 48 hours prior
 to arrival at venue.
- All out-of-state equines require negative Coggins current within six months of the event. Vet health
 certificate required for horses coming into Washington State. Please check with your vet for particulars,
 as state requirements can change.
- Biosecurity measures are followed at all EI events. For more info: https://www.usef.org/search?q=biosecurity

Special needs, vehicle sharing, and scheduling requests:

Please state clearly on the entry form if you have special needs or equipment or essential personnel sharing. Requests made after closing date may not be honored if schedules for the event have already been finalized.

Show Attire:

Appropriate Dressage/Cones attire (helmet or hat, jacket, apron, gloves, etc) is encouraged. In the case of inclement weather, attire guidelines will be relaxed. See Safety section for helmet and marathon vest requirements.

Misc. Show info:

- Limited number of **golf carts** available for rental, first come, first served. Enter and reserve early for best chance at getting one. \$190 for a cart that seats two; \$275 for a cart that seats four. Separate check not required.
- Food Available on Grounds: Concession stand TBD
- Social Events: Gather at 6:30 pm on Saturday for a community potluck and awards for Dressage Festival, and Derby. If you prefer to contribute dollars instead of a dish for the potluck, contribute \$10 per person in the office by 2 pm that day.
- Camping/parking spots to be assigned. Please list overall rig length on entry form (and any parking preferences) and we will do our best to accommodate.
- Dogs are allowed. Dogs must always be on leash and under control.
- Camping on Grounds: Dry camping only no utility hook-ups. If you have special medical needs such as electricity for medical equipment, please notify the organizer in advance.
- No lunging in camping/parking area.

Directions:

Rainbow Meadow Farm is located at 4711 176th Ave SW, Rochester, WA. Use this address if you are assigned parking by the permanent barns. If you are assigned to park and stable in the portable stalls stabling area (called show stabling below), use 17743 Leitner Rd SW, Rochester, WA in your GPS to get to the correct facility entrance. Here are directions in case you need them:

- If you are coming from I-5 take exit 88. Turn east onto Old Highway 99 SE which is a right turn if you exit from northbound I5 and a left turn if you exit from southbound I5.
- In 2.5 miles, turn left onto 183rd Ave SW
- In .1 mile turn right onto Danby Rd SW
- In .9 miles Danby Rd turns 90 degrees and becomes Leitner Rd SW.
- If you are assigned parking in the **show stabling area**, the entrance is 300 feet and on the left just before the start of the white fence.
- If you are assigned **parking by the permanent barns** (daily haul-ins and medical needs) in .3 miles Leitner Rd SW turns into 176th Ave SE. Follow the white fence around the corner and turn left at the yellow barn with the big rainbow.
