An Introduction to Carriage Driving - May 20, 2022 (Saturday)
and/or

An Introduction to Combined Driving - May 21, 2022 (Sunday)

Event Description: These are two separate driving clinics – an introduction to carriage driving on Saturday and an introduction to combined driving on Sunday. Participants can register for either one or both clinics based upon their current level of experience and interest.

Introduction to Carriage Driving Clinic (Saturday 9am – 5pm): This is an educational one-day clinic for those who want to learn about carriage driving from the ground up. Participants will learn about the selection of the horse, education of the horse and driver, harnessing, choice of vehicle, hitching, and on-the-ground skills. Participants will watch and practice harnessing, ground driving, hitching, and will have the opportunity to ride on a carriage. Participants will not bring their own horses. School horses and equipment will be furnished, but you should bring your helmet if you have one. You will receive a notebook of written/educational materials to take home. Driving safety will be a special focus in every step of this clinic.

Introduction to Combined Driving Clinic (Sunday 9am – 5pm): This is an educational one-day clinic which explains and demonstrates the sport and art of combined driving. Combined driving is a three-phase competition that consists of dressage, marathon, and cones. The clinic will consist of lectures and demonstrations for each of the phases, with plenty of opportunity for questions and answers as well as the opportunity to practice skills learned. School horses will be used. You should bring your helmet if you have one. Clinic participants will not bring their own horses. You will receive a notebook of written/educational materials to take home. Driving safety will be emphasized.

Entry Fee: If registering for either the Saturday OR Sunday clinic: \$120. Equestrians Institute members receive a \$20 discount (\$100 entry fee). One spouse or child may also attend for an additional \$80 (\$60 for EI members). Please note, only one resource book is provided for the two participants to share.

If registering for both clinics – Saturday AND Sunday: \$200. Equestrians Institute members receive a \$40 discount (\$160 entry fee). One spouse or child may also attend for an additional \$120 (\$100 for EI members).

Post-entry fee, (call first), add \$20. All fees are US dollars. Make checks payable to “Equestrians Institute”. OTHER INFORMATION:

- Event Attire: Dress comfortably for the weather. Wear sturdy shoes, no sandals. Helmets are required for hands-on work with horses. Safety vests are helpful but not mandatory for the Saturday clinic. Safety vests are mandatory while on the carriage during the Sunday marathon practice. Some loaner safety vests will be available.
- BYO brown-bag lunch.
- If you need help finding local lodging, please contact the organizer for information.
- Kindly leave dogs home unless they are truly service animals. Dogs are allowed on leash, but you’re going to need your hands free for clinic participation.

DIRECTIONS: There is no business sign at the driveway. If you use 12305**B** Ingraham Rd, Snohomish WA (note, not **A** which is the mailing address) in your GPS it will take you to the correct driveway. The driveway is gravel and has a very wide entrance from the road. Across from the driveway is a single post with two black mailboxes that have red, yellow, and white reflective stripes on the side.
