Entry Fees: Make checks payable to Equestrians Institute. Note that this year for clarity, required basic day-use fees are ala carte.

Basic Day Use Fee: Basic Day Use Fees apply to Friday and Saturday events. No open schooling Thursday or Sunday. How about changing the wording to something like "Basic Day Use Fees are mandatory if you will be on driving your horse on Friday and/or Saturday to either school or participate in the scheduled events.

Basic Kitchen Sink day fee -- one day -- \$50 (\$45 for EI members)

Basic Kitchen Sink day fee -- two days -- \$90 (\$80 for EI members)

(Please note that if you arrive Thursday, the Driving Clinic will still be going on. If you want to school that day, please consider pre-registering that day as a clinic auditor. As a registered auditor, you may drive your horse, and lunch and dinner are included. See separate Driving Clinic omnibus and entry for this option.)

If you want to stay for Sunday but not drive the DT, we'd love to have you as a volunteer, and you'll get lunch.

Friday:

Lessons with Stacey are \$100 per hour-long lesson (EI members get \$20 member discount). It is not required that you be registered with the previous week's clinic to take Stacey lessons during the Kitchen Sink, but you may if you want to. Lessons do not include schooling outside of your lessons.

Driving Derby fee is \$25 per go. (EI members receive \$2 discount per go.) This entry fee is for the Driving Derby only and does not include any private lessons, open schooling, or DT.

Saturday:

Dressage Festival entry fee of \$40 for two tests (EI member discount of \$5) or \$25 for one test (EI member discount of \$2). Participation in the Dressage Festival is optional. This does not include lessons, open schooling, or DT. Please state on your entry form which dressage test(s) you want to have judged.

Sunday:

\$80 (US) entry fee for one-day Driving Trial. EI members receive a \$10 discount (\$70 entry fee). This entry fee does not include any private lessons or participation in the dressage festival or derby. Participation in the dressage festival, derby and private lessons is optional. No schooling is allowed on this day, so there is no additional Day Use Fee.

Stall Arrangements:

- Stalls are available Thursday noon through Sunday 6 p.m.
- \$95 for entire weekend.
- \$70 for two nights only
- \$45 for one night only
- Initial bedding provided, final cleaning provided
- Additional bags of shavings available at \$10 per bag
- No stall deposit required
- Daily haul-in in lieu of stall(s) is allowed -- \$25 fee for weekend per entry.
- Self-stalling may be allowed in designated area only if barn is full -- \$25 fee for weekend per entry. Please indicate special preferences with your entry.

Cones course, marathon obstacles, and dressage arenas will be available for open schooling when not in use by lessons, Dressage Festival and Driving Derby.

Driving Derby 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Horses may go around a maximum of three times.

Cones course, marathon obstacles, and dressage arenas when not in use by dressage festival and pleasure classes will be available for open schooling.

Driven Dressage Festival 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Drivers choose Dressage test(s) they wish to drive and specify on their entry form. A schedule will be posted no later than Friday morning before the event. The schedule will be in accordance with tests being driven and needed arena size. Select tests from those listed on www.americandrivingsociety.org/dressage_test.asp. For Advanced tests, go to www.fei.org/fei/your-role/organisers/driving/dressage-tests. Please indicate on your entry form which test your turnout will use.

Dressage Tests:

- Training Test #2 POM for all turnouts -- arena size 40x80 or 30x60
- Preliminary Test #3 POM for singles and pairs; #5 POM for multiples -- arena size 40x80 or 30x60
- Intermediate Test #4 for singles and pairs --arena size 40x80 or 30x60; Intermediate Test #1 for multiples -- arena size 40x100 or 30x75
- Advanced tests: Singles: 3*C HP1; Pairs 3*C HP2; multiples 3*C HP4 -- arena size 40x100 or 30x75

Cones: Immediately following Dressage

Speeds and clearances per ADS/FEI rules

Marathon: 1 p.m. – 5 p.m.

All participants will follow the same course. Maximum of 6 km. 4 to 5 obstacles depending on weather conditions and footing.

Awards: As soon after Marathon as possible!

OTHER INFORMATION:**Awards:**

- Dressage Festival ribbons - top five placings for each level - classes (by size of equine and number of equines in turnout) will be grouped together for Dressage awards. If multiple tests driven, the best score per level will be used in the award calculations.
- Driving Trial ribbons – top five placings for each class.
- Driving Derby, top five placings in each division.

Veterinary Health Requirements:

- To promote health and welfare of all horses, Equestrians Institute complies with ADS rules regarding horse welfare, including but not limited to vaccination requirements. (Art 6.3)

- All equines (except Washington, Oregon, and Idaho) require negative Coggins from no longer ago than June 28, 2017. Vet certificate required for horses coming into Washington State. Please check with your vet for particulars, as state requirements may change.
- Biosecurity measures are followed at all EI events.

Multiple Entries Allowed:

Yes, provided scheduling permits. Must be requested with entries to be considered.

Refund Policy: \$25 office fee will be deducted from all refunds. Before closing date, full refund minus office fee. After closing date up until 72 hours before event starts, full refund minus office fee only if can backfill from waiting list. No refunds after 72 hours prior to event start.

Show Attire: Appropriate Dressage/Cones attire (helmet or hat, jacket, apron, gloves, etc) is encouraged. In the case of inclement weather, attire guidelines will be relaxed. Helmets mandatory for Marathon and Derby – encouraged at all times. Protective vests are also highly recommended. Helmets and protective vests are required for juniors at all times while on a carriage.

Medical Armbands:

Medical armbands, or their equivalent such as Road ID, are required at all times for all persons riding on a cart or carriage. Medical armbands will be available for purchase at the show office.

Misc. Show info:

- Limited number of golf carts available for rental, first come, first served. Enter and reserve early for best chance at getting one. \$155 for a cart that seats two; \$235 for a cart that seats four. Please send separate check made out to EI. Your check will be returned if we're sold out by the time you enter.
- No lunging in camping/parking area.
- Please turn off generators after 10 p.m.
- Stalls and camping/parking spots to be assigned. Please list preferences on entry form and we will do our best to accommodate.

Food Available on Grounds:

Yes – breakfast and lunch concession on Saturday and Sunday.

Social Event: Potluck dinner on Saturday evening at 6:30. Bring a dish to share – or if you would prefer, chip in \$8 per person at the office and a deli run will be made.

Camping on Grounds: Yes, no hook-ups. If you have special medical needs, please contact the organizer in advance.

Directions: Ethel Events Center is located at 1489 US Hwy 12: From I-5, take Exit 68 (Highway 12 east, toward Yakima), go east 7 miles. Venue entry is on the left -- look for arch at driveway. Westbound traffic on Highway 12 -- entry is on right at mile 73.5 (½ mile past Shell Station at Leonard Road intersection).
